DAY-1



The inaugural ceremony of the YUVASAMWAD intra Model United Nations (MUN) witnessed an enthusiastic start with the lightening of lamp followed by Ganesh Vandana and cultural performance, setting the stage for constructive debates and diplomatic discourse across three key committees: Lok Sabha, All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM), and United Nations General Assembly (UNGA). Here's the review:

the first session the 20-member Parliament In committee, led by speaker Adv. Aman Yadav, began with a 90-second speech by PM Narendra Modi endorsing "One Nation, One Election." Delegates discussed electoral reforms, emphasizing simultaneous elections and engaged in nuanced discussions on the pros and cons of the proposal. Topics included constitutional amendments and the Election Commission's role. The session ended with a lunch break at 2 pm. In the second session starting at 3:00 pm, delegates explored the Anti-Defection Law, focusing on its role in ensuring stable governments and preserving parliamentary integrity. A Zero Hour session addressed reservation policies, sparking democratic debates on their efficacy and social justice implications.



AIPPM Committee at Yuva Samvaad MUN 1st Edition held a 2-day event at FIMT with 27 contenders as politicians. Co-Moderators Adv. Rakib Sabri and Mr. Ayush Vishwakarma, along with Advisor Ms. Shreeya Mohapatra, led the executive board. Session 1 focused on Gender Neutrality in Indian Laws with an opening statement in a public session. Session 2 continued with a written public session for contemplative discussions on the complexities of gender neutrality.



The first day of discussions in the UNGA committee led by Adv. Shwetank Upadhyay focused on the critical agenda of promoting peaceful resolution of territorial disputes to prevent conflicts and foster diplomacy. Delegates from various member states engaged in constructive dialogue aimed at addressing the root causes of territorial disputes exploring diplomatic solutions to and mitigate tensions.the first day of discussions in the UNGA committee provided a valuable platform for member states to exchange views, share insights, and explore practical strategies for promoting peaceful resolution of territorial disputes. Delegates expressed their commitment to continued engagement on this pressing issue and looked forward to further productive deliberations in the days ahead.



DAY-2

Session 3 delved into the constitutional approach towards gender-neutral laws in a public session. This was followed by a private session in an open debate format discussing the transformation of gender-biased laws into genderneutral laws in personal laws. Participants delivered written speeches in a subsequent public session, addressing gender-neutral laws in reservations. Meticulous documentation throughout both days captured discussions, proposals, and resolutions for future analysis and reference.



The UNGA committee reaffirmed its commitment to promoting peaceful resolution of territorial disputes, preventing conflicts, and fostering diplomacy. Delegates expressed their determination to continue working collaboratively towards achieving these objectives, recognizing the fundamental importance of peace and stability in advancing the goals of the United Nations and promoting global security and prosperity. Delegates also emphasized the importance of addressing the root causes of territorial disputes, including historical grievances, socio-economic disparities, and identitybased conflicts. They highlighted the need for comprehensive approaches that address both immediate concerns and long-term stability, including development assistance, capacity-building efforts, and conflict prevention strategies.





In the fourth session Lok Sabha Committee of Youva Samvaad MUN 2024 began at 9:00 am with 20 delegates. Opening speeches on the Criminalization of Politics, each lasting 60+1 seconds, delved into historical backgrounds and debated corruption. Another session covered Religion and Vote Bank Politics, emphasizing global perspectives and India's cultural diversity. Chit passing occurred between sessions. In the fifth session delegates presented researched laws and proposed policies in hard copies, concluding the Lok Sabha Committee session. Personal perspectives and feedback were shared, and the EB motivated participants, drawing from their experiences.



The Yuva Samvaad Model United Nations (MUN) 2024 Closing Ceremony celebrated a successful two-day event, highlighted by addresses from key dignitaries by Shri V.K.N. Bhardwaj, Prof. (Dr.) M. Afzal Wani, Prof. (Dr.) Saroj Vyas, Prof. (Dr.) Shaveta Gagneja, felicitation of distinguished guests, and an award distribution ceremony.
